Objectives of O3

- to set up, organize and monitor a series of participatory activities and CS workshops (8 in total) that will involve researchers and professionals from the HEIs and CHIs in the consortium and their related networks, students and citizens
- to produce and test innovative approaches for CS in the cultural heritage field, especially those supported by digital technologies that have a great potential for more active engagement of local communities in heritage and culture
- final objective would be to produce a final sets of guidelines and best practices for the effective replicability of the applied approaches.





Development and testing of participatory approaches

- HE and CH project partners are organising and running a defined series of Citizen Science workshops
- Each event is hosted and organised in collaboration between at least one HE and one CH partners
- This aims to test different kinds of participatory approaches in citizen science projects applied to cultural heritage





HISTORY IN PICTURES FROM BULGARIA 26-27/04/2021

In this event, students of digital humanities from the **University of Sofia** worked on metadata improvement, by annotating and enriching the beautiful digitized collection of early Bulgarian photography published by **NALIS Foundation** in Europeana.

Result of the action is over 5.000 new metadata added to nearly 700 heritage photographs.

COLLECTION DAY FOR FAMILY PHOTOGRAPHS IN PISA 28/06/2022

On the occasion of the first CitizenHeritage Multiplier Event held in Pisa, a digitization and collection desk was organized, inviting participants to share heritage photos from their family albums, which were digitized on the spot by a professional photographer, and then aggregated by **Photoconsortium** and published in Europeana, the European digital library. An evaluation survey was submitted to the participants to understand their thoughts about sharing personal heritage in the context of an open science approach.






ENRICHING TEXTILE HERITAGE
